TAM's Haub Curator of Western American Art Faith Brower has partnered with guest curator India Young from Victoria, B.C., to bring together a selection of prints by Northwest Coast Native and First Nations artists who have defined six decades of printmaking in the Pacific Northwest. Some of the printmaking from the Northwest Coast can be immediately recognized by high-contrast, black and red graphics. Despite some assumptions that Northwest Coast art is limited to this kind of imagery, Indigenous printmaking in the region has always been exploratory and innovative. Through the print medium artists expand on their visual languages to create works that broaden the scope of Northwest Coast art.
