Summary of Position:

The Curator of Contemporary and Modern Art is a highly important position within the curatorial team. Made possible by the Rebecca and Jack Benaroya Endowment, the position assists with the day-to-day functions of the Curatorial Department, while working to research and create exhibitions from our modern and contemporary art collection. This largely includes Northwest contemporary and modern art in all media, including painting, photography, studio glass, studio jewelry and ceramics. The Curator advances the museum's mission through the research and presentation of the permanent collection, and on the planning, development and presentation of international and national touring special exhibitions relating to contemporary and modern art, including occasional scholarly publications.

Core Responsibilities:

- Work collaboratively with the Executive Director and curatorial staff to determine goals of the exhibition, collection, and publication programs for the museum
- Conceptualize and develop contemporary and modern Northwest art exhibitions and publications
- Collaborate with the Education Department to develop audience engagement and interpretive strategies for exhibitions and the permanent collection
- Write exhibition texts and collection texts
- In collaboration with the rest of the Curatorial team, develop and manage budgets for exhibitions, publications, and special projects
- Develop content for exhibition-related social media tools
- In collaboration with the director and other curators, work with collectors, patrons, artists, and others to bring in gifts of related art for the permanent collection
- Participate in the museum's Diversity, Equity, Inclusion and Access (DEIA) trainings and bring a DEIA lens to TAM's exhibitions and collections strategies, presenting diverse voices and faces in our contemporary art exhibitions
- Perform other tasks and duties as necessary
